AFFIANT'S TRAINING, EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE

- I, Robert C. LaBarge, Jr. being duly sworn, depose and say: I am currently a trooper in the Massachusetts State Police. I graduated from the Massachusetts State Police Academy in November 1996. I have been a police officer since 1989, and in that time, I have been a municipal police officer, deputy sheriff, military policeman, and a state trooper. I have taken part in numerous investigations; including but not limited to homicides, sexual assaults, larceny investigations, narcotics investigations, and fraud investigations. I have been awarded a masters degree in Criminal Justice Administration from Western New England College, Springfield, MA. I am currently assigned to the Essex State Police Detective Unit, Essex County District Attorney's Office, located at 10 Federal Street, Salem, MA. I have been assigned to the Essex State Police Detective Unit since December of 2001. My previous assignments have included the Uniform Branch of the State Police, having been assigned to the Concord, Lee, and Springfield Barracks and the B-Troop Community Action Team. These assignments have included many investigations of various forms of criminal activity. I have received basic police training at the Massachusetts State Police Academy, New Hampshire Police Academy, and United States Army Military Police School. I also have received extensive specialized training in many areas of criminal investigation, including: homicide investigations, child fatality investigations, basic crime scene investigation, search warrants, sexual assaults, crimes against children, crimes against persons with disabilities, crimes against the elderly, interview and interrogation, internet and computer crime, basic and advanced criminal investigative analysis, burglary/robbery investigation, DNA Buccal swabbing, and various other courses and seminars. I have applied for and received over seventyfive search warrants in my career, and have participated in hundreds of search warrants. I have taken part in over one hundred homicide investigations and over five hundred death investigations in my career.
- 2. I, along with other law enforcement officers have information based upon personal knowledge, observation and belief as follows:

PHILIP CHISM REPORTED MISSING

3. On October 22, 2013 at approximately 1834 hours, the Danvers Police were contacted by an individual identified as Diana Chism. Diana Chism was later identified as the mother of Philip Chism, a student at Danvers, MA, High School. Ms. Chism stated that her son Philip, fourteen years old, date of birth: January 21, 1999, had not come home from school and she said that she was unable to locate him on the school grounds at the athletic facility. It was learned that Philip Chism was of biracial ethnicity. The Danvers High School is located at 60 Cabot Road, Danvers, MA. After she called the Danvers Police, Ms. Chism went to the Danvers Police Station to fill out a missing person report.

CELL PHONE PING/SOCIAL MEDIA OUTREACH

4. The Danvers Police spoke to Ms. Chism and learned that Philip Chism was in possession of an AT&T cellular phone. The Danvers Police then requested that AT&T "ping" the aforementioned cellular phone. "Pinging" a cellular phone is a procedure where the cellular provider or carrier can locate the phone using current technology. AT&T representatives advised that they "pinged" the phone at 1628 hours. They advised that the phone was last known to be in the vicinity of Hollywood Hits Theater, located off of Endicott Street in Danvers, MA. A canvass search of the area was conducted and it was learned that Philip Chism purchased a ticket to a movie and left afterwards. An additional "ping" was initiated with negative results. The Danvers Police utilized their social media outlets, e.g. twitter, facebook, reverse 911, and alerted surrounding cities and towns.

PHONE CONVERSATION WITH SUE AMBROZAVITCH COLLEEN RITZER IS KNOWN TO BE MISSING

On October 23, 2013 at approximately 1815 hours, I had a phone conversation 5. with Danvers High School Principal Sue Ambrozavitch. Ms. Ambrozavitch said that on October 22, 2013 at approximately 1800 hours, Carrie Gent, who was a mother of a student at Danvers High School, personally contacted her. She said that Mrs. Gent said that Philip Chism was observed around 1530 hours, on October 22, 2013, running away from the High School. Mrs. Ambrozavitch said that she told Mrs. Gent to go the police. Mrs. Ambrozavitch told me that at approximately 2100 hours she sent out a mass email to her staff at the high school and informed them of Philip Chism missing. She said at around that time she received a call from Sarah Giaquinta, who is a math teacher with Colleen Ritzer. Sarah Giaquinta informed her that she received a call from Colleen Ritzer's parents, Tom and Peggie Ritzer. She said that Sarah Giaquinta told her that Colleen's parents said that she was missing. Mrs. Ambrozavitch said that Sarah Giaquinta knew that Philip Chism was in Colleen Ritzer's last period class. She said that Sarah was concerned because both Colleen and Philip were missing and she knew that Philip's last class of the day was with Colleen Ritzer.

PHONE CONVERSATION WITH SUE AMBROZAVITCH SEARCH AT DANVERS HIGH SCHOOL

6. Mrs. Ambrozavitch said that she, along with others, including Danvers Police, went to the High School to look for Colleen Ritzer. She said that Colleen Ritzer's car was observed in the parking lot of the high school. Mrs. Ambrozavitch said that they went to Colleen Ritzer's classroom and observed that her belongings were missing. She said that Tom and Peggie Ritzer went to the High School first, and then went to the Danvers Police Station to file a missing person report.

COLLEEN RITZER'S CELL PHONE PINGED

7. As a result of the missing person report, the Danvers Police requested that Colleen Ritzer's cell phone be "pinged." This "ping" revealed that the last known location of her cell phone was in the area of the Holten Richmond Middle School, located at 55 Conant Street, Danvers, MA.

VIDEO SURVEILLANCE TIMELINE AT DANVERS HIGH SCHOOL

- 8. On October 23, 2013, Officer Steven Baldassare, of the Danvers Police, reviewed surveillance footage from cameras located at the Danvers High School. I have subsequently reviewed some of this surveillance video footage. I have also spoken with Officer Baldassare about what was observed on the video surveillance. Officer Baldassare said that he spoke to the school Information Technology person (Jay) who informed him that the times on the video were accurate. Officer Baldassare gave me the following timeline from his personal observations of video footage at the high school from October 22, 2013:
 - 1428-1432 hours- Colleen Ritzer and Mrs. Giaquinta are observed talking in the hallway on the second floor.
 - 1454- Colleen Ritzer exits classroom A209 and walks towards the women's rest.
 room.
 - 1454- Philip Chism walks into the hallway and then walks back into classroom A209.
 - 1454- Philip Chism walks out of classroom A209 with a hood over his head.
 - 1454- Colleen Ritzer enters the 2nd floor female student restroom.
 - 1455- Philip Chism enters the same bathroom with a hood over his head, donning gloves.
 - 1506- A student identified as walks into the aforementioned bathroom, quickly walks out, then is observed walking down the hallway toward the B wing.
 - 1507- Philip Chism is observed walking out of the aforementioned bathroom with a hood over his head.
 - 1508- Philip Chism is observed walking down the hallway toward the B wing.
 - 1508- Philip Chism walks down the B wing stairs and exits to the A wing student parking lot sidewalk.
 - 1509- Philip Chism enters building A wing doors wearing a white t-shirt, jeans and gray sneakers.

- 1509- Philip Chism runs down the first floor hallway.
- 1510-Philip Chism climbs the D wing steps to the second floor.
- 1510- Philip Chism enters classroom A209.
- 1511- Philip Chism exits classroom A209 with a red hooded sweatshirt over his head. He is seen carrying a gray/yellow backpack, black bag and a purple bag.
- 1511- Philip Chism is observed exiting downstairs wearing a red hooded sweatshirt over his head. He is seen carrying a gray/yellow backpack, black bag and a purple bag.
- 1514- Philip Chism is observed wearing a red sweatshirt and was observed pulling a recycle barrel towards the elevator.
- 1516- Philip Chism is observed wearing a red sweatshirt, exiting the elevator and pulling the recycle barrel into the aforementioned second floor bathroom
- 1522- Philip Chism is observed exiting the aforementioned women's bathroom wearing a white t-shirt and black face mask, pulling the recycle barrel to the elevator.
- 1523- Philip Chism is observed exiting A wing pulling the recycle barrel wearing a white t-shirt, jeans, and a black mask on his forehead.
- 1525- Philip Chism is observed pulling a recycle barrel from behind a dumpster toward the field house.
- 1532- Philip Chism is observed pulling a recycle barrel away from the field house, passing dumpsters, continuing toward the student parking lot.
- 1600- Philip Chism is observed entering the A wing doors, wearing a white t-shirts, jeans and barefooted.
- 1601- Philip Chism is observed wearing jeans on the third floor heading towards his locker.
- 1604- Philip Chism is observed wearing a black shirt, with glasses, carrying jeans, with a Nike backpack on his back.
- 1605- Philip Chism is observed entering the aforementioned second floor bathroom, and then exits at 1606 hours.
- 1606- Philip is observed exiting the aforementioned second floor bathroom, and then leaves the building through the first floor A wing doors.

Danvers Police Officer Stephanie Wennerberg subsequently observed red/brown stains consistent with blood in the area of the second floor bathroom. Danvers Police Detective Robert Sullivan also reviewed the video surveillance footage and reported that he observed what appeared to blood on Philip Chism's pants after he left the aforementioned second floor woman's room.

TOPSFIELD POLICE LOCATES PHILIP CHISM

9. On October 23, 2013 at approximately 0030 hours, the Topsfield Police were called regarding a pedestrian walking, north in the southbound lane, on Route 1 North at Salem Road. Topsfield Police Officer Neil Hovey found this individual walking in this area. Officer Hovey realized that the person he was talking to was Philip Chism, who he

Officer Hovey realized that the person he was talking to was Philip Chism, who he had previously learned was a missing person from Danvers. Officer Hovey conducted a pat frisk for safety reasons and discovered that Philip Chism had a knife on his person. Officer Hovey transported Philip Chism back to the Topsfield Police Station. Officer Hovey inventoried the contents of Philip Chism's backpack and a bloodstained boxcutter was found. Officer Hovey asked the defendant where the blood on the box cutter came from. Chism responded, "The girl." Also located from the possessions of Mr. Chism were many credit cards and two Massachusetts Driver's licenses belonging to Colleen Ritzer. Philip Chism stated that he found the items at Stop and Shop and then further stated that he got the items out of her car. A pair of woman's bluish/green sheer underwear were found in Chism's backpack as well. Officer Hovey then notified the Danvers Police of what had occurred. Philip Chism was later transported to the Danvers Police Station, placed under arrest, and charged with murder in violation of M.G.L. 265§1.

BODY OF COLLEEN RITZER FOUND

A search of the school grounds and adjacent wooded area were conducted in the 10. early morning hours of October 23, 2013. The body of Colleen Ritzer was subsequently found in a wooded area near the school. Colleen Ritzer was pronounced dead by Lyons Ambulance Paramedic Nick Henderson. Detective Robert Sullivan of the Danvers Police observed the body and he said that it was found in a supine position covered with leaves and debris in manner consistent with attempts to hide the body from being seen. The victim's throat was slit. A green recycle bin consistent with what was observed in the video was found approximately twenty yards from Colleen Ritzer's body. Detective Sullivan said that the victim's shirt was lifted above her breasts, and the bra was pulled below her breasts. No clothing was observed on the victim's body from the waist down. He also advised me that the victim's legs were spread apart and slightly bent in what appeared to be a "sexually staged" or "sexual positioned" manner. He said that he also observed what appeared to be an approximate three foot long by inch in diameter bark less tree branch inserted into her vagina, in which also was consistent with "sexual staging" or "sexual positioning." Blood and pubic hair were subsequently observed on the branch after it was removed and secured for evidentiary purposes. Clothing and other belongings were found in bushes near the body. Blood soaked gloves consistent with the gloves observed in the video surveillance were found near the body of Colleen Ritzer.

HANDWRITTEN NOTE FOUND NEXT TO BODY

11. A handwritten folded note was found next to the victim's body. Massachusetts State Police Crime Scene Services investigators unfolded the note, which revealed writing stating 'T hate you all."

INTERVIEW OF DIANA CHISM- MOTHER OF PHILIP CHISM

12. On the morning of October 23, 2013, Sergeant Tansey and Trooper Buccheri interviewed Diana Chism. Diana Chism is the mother of Philip Chism. She said that she

Diana Chism introduced a woman who accompanied her to the police station as her aunt Alisha Leck. She said that she lived in the basement apartment with her son, the aforementioned Philip Chism and Philip's two siblings. Diana Chism told investigators that she was going through a divorce with Philip's father and they recently moved from their living arrangements in Tennessee to 10 Riverside Street in Danvers, MA. She said that it was a stressful divorce.

CELLULAR PHONES LOCATED IN THE VICINITY OF HOLLYWOOD HITS

On the morning of October 23, 2013, officers of the investigative team were directed by Philip Chism to go the area of Hollywood Hits Movie Theater where there was a woodpile. This Hollywood Hits Movie Theater location was where the phone was last "pinged" on the evening of October 22, 2013. Two cellular phones, an iphone and Samsung cellular phone were found smashed at this location. I know from my training an experience that today's cellular phones are actually mini computers, capable of storing photos, videos, sending and receiving emails with connectivity to the internet.

INTERVIEW OF

On October 23, 2013 at approximately 1033 hours, Sergeant Tansey and Trooper Buccheri interviewed The video surveillance clearly identified 14. as the young woman who entered the bathroom at October 22, 2013 at 1506 hours. said that she entered the second floor bathroom in an attempt to call her father. She said that when she entered the bathroom, she saw what she believed to be a person's exposed "butt" of an individual who she thought was changing their clothes. She said the person was standing up, but appeared to be leaning over. She said that she observed clothes on the floor. She was questioned about the color of the butt and she said that she thought the skin color was darker. She said that she then turned around and then is Caucasion. left the bathroom. Phillip Chism is biracial and

INTERVIEW OF

On October 23, 2013 at approximately 1736 hours, Massachusetts State Police 15. Trooper Steven Buccheri and Danvers Police Detective Sergeant Philip Tansey, is a ninth grade student interviewed a student identified as at Danvers High School. stated that she, Ms. Ritzer and Philip Chism were together in Colleen Ritzer's class after school had ended on October 22, 2013. She said that she was in the class getting extra work from Ms. Ritzer. She said that Philip and Ms. Ritzer were having a conversation about China. She said that at some point, Ms. Ritzer mentioned Tennessee. She said that Philip became visibly upset after she mentioned Tennessee. She said that Ms. Ritzer apparently was unaware that Philip was upset and she continued to talk about Tennessee. She said that Ms. Ritzer became aware that Philip was getting upset about her talking about Tennessee. She said that Ms. Ritzer later changed the topic. She also said that she observed Philip apparently talking to himself in the classroom.

REQUEST FOR CRIME LAB PERSONNEL TO PROCESS RESIDENCE

- 16. I have personal knowledge, based upon my experience and training, that crimes of violence often involve a struggle, a break, the use of weapons and other instrumentalities. I also know that the person or persons participating in the commission of a violent offense are in contact with the physical surroundings in a forceful or otherwise detectable manner. I also know that there is often an attempt to alter, destroy, remove, clean up or cover up evidence of a crime but that traces may be left in the form of blood, semen, saliva, physiological fluids and secretions, hair, fibers, fingerprints, palm prints, footprints, and shoeprints. Many of the above items are minute and/or microscopic, thus requiring additional specialized examination by forensic laboratory techniques.
- 17. I also have personal knowledge based on my training and experience, and also the collective training and experience of all the investigators working on this investigation, that a crime scene will contain physical evidence which will aid in establishing the identity of perpetrator(s), the circumstances under which the crime was committed and/or which in general, will assist in the discovery of the pertinent facts; and that such evidence requires a systematic search to locate, seize, record, photograph, measure and process, and I am requesting that these aforementioned processes be granted. Based upon the foregoing facts and information,

CHISM'S ACTIVITIES CONSISTENT WITH PREPLANNING

18. Because Philip Chism came to school armed with a boxcutter, a balaclava/ski mask, gloves, and a multiple changes of clothing, I have reason to believe he planned the crime. Based on my training and experience, I know that perpetrators who conduct such planning sometimes bring with them to a crime, documents reflecting their planning of the crime. I also know that persons committing these types of crimes sometimes document their planning of the crime and maintain those plans in their place of residence in document form or on computers/cell phones/iPads/ or other technological devices capable of storing notes.

COMPUTERS/ELECTRONIC DEVICES USED IN RELATION TO CRIMES

19. Based on my training and experience and the collective experience and training of the other officers involved in the investigation, I know that it is presently common for a person who has committed a crime to use a cell phone prior to, during, and/or after committing the crime. Also based on the collective experience of the investigative team, often times, persons who have committed sexually based violent crimes have a prior interest in their victims. These persons often will have an obsession and this obsession can include internet searches for their victims and sexual fetish based internet inquiries. Also, based on the collective investigative experience of the involved officers, it is common for perpetrators of crimes who document or memorialize their planning of the crime either in writing or on technological devices do so in safe, private places, like their residences so that they are not seen. Based on my training in today's day and age, computers, cameras and cell phones and audio devices often contain reflections and memorializations of a person's relationship with other persons. Also through my training

Also through my training and experience I have learned that individuals involved in crimes sometimes before, during and after memorialize their crimes through their present day electronic devices using cameras, computers, cell phones or storage devices that could contain, collect and hold audio, video or digital sound and or images related to their crimes and/or conduct online searches on published past crimes in the media, or computer searches on how to commit crimes or kill people, certain sexual fetishes and proclivities, and/or how to evade detection after a person has committed a crime.

ITEMS TO BE SEARCHED FOR

20. Therefore, based on the information contained herein, and on my training and experience, and the collective training and experience of the investigators working on this homicide, I believe there is probable cause to believe that evidence of the crime of Murder, to wit will be found in Philip Chism's residence: documents describing planning the crime, the defendants mental status; and any nexus for the reason the defendant expressed his hate for everyone as described in the note found adjacent to the victim's body, documents, including textbooks or class work, receipts, notes, photographs, video recordings and audio recordings, internet searches and browsing activity." In the event that there is more than one computer at the house and police cannot determine which one is Philip Chism's, I seek permission to seize all computers so that computer forensic experts employed by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts can conduct a forensic search of each one to determine which was used by Philip Chism.

LOCATION TO BE SEARCHED

21.
